All the classes have now visited the garden and spoken about what they like about it and how we can improve it.

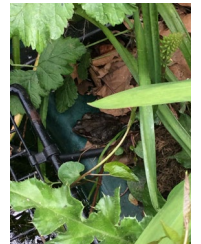
Each class will be visiting the garden regularly to see the updates now that work has started.
