PE

PE lessons in Year 5 take place on **Tuesday**.

Please ensure that your children **brings** the correct PE kit to school each week; this includes trainers and not their school shoes.

Book Bags

Please ensure your child's reading book and reading record book are brought to school every day in their book bags.

Children should read **every day** at home and leave a comment in their reading record at least 3 times a week. Books will be changed on **Friday**.

Homework

In Year 5 your child's homework will be mainly on IXL. They may also be given some independent research tasks, according to what we are studying aside from English and Maths. It is always great to see children take the initiative to find out about topics themselves and many of them did so last year.

Homework plays a vital role in helping children consolidate what they have learnt in class and it is really important that all children complete their homework each week independently.

Reading

Children should take part in a reading activity **every night**.

Reading will help your child develop in all areas of the curriculum and your support at home can have the greatest impact on your child's overall achievement.

Maths and Grammar on IXL

Children should spend at least 75 minutes a week on IXL. This time should be spread between Maths and Grammar activities recommended each week.

Spelling

Spelling words will be taken from the spelling patterns learnt in class as well as the Year 5 and 6 statutory spelling word list.

Children will be tested on 10 words each week (on Friday).
