What is the Sports Premium?

The Department for Education (DfE) spent over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools over the last 4 academic years.

The Premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of primary aged pupils within and beyond the school day to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

Strategic overview of PPSG (Primary PE Sports Funding) spending:

- To further improve the PE provision at Burdett-Coutts.
- To broaden the sporting opportunities available to our pupils, through in school lessons and as those offered as Enrichment Club Activities.
- To include as many pupils as possible into competitive sport through entering a wide range of competitions at all age ranges.
- To continue to develop a love of sport and physical activity, including the benefit that sport can have on supporting positive mental health.
- To develop a range of activities and lessons to support the learning and understanding of nutrition on our bodies and minds.

Our school allocation for 2022/2023

Our school has been awarded £13,500 for the academic year 2022/2023 and we intend to use the funding as outlined below.

Swimming lessons for Years 3 - 6. These will run as a block of 2 hour lessons over an 8 day block (2 blocks of 4 days) at Queens Mothers Pool	£4000	Opportunity to gain confidence, increase fitness levels and give lifelong swimming and learning skills.	<p>This new style of booking was welcomed by school staff, swimming staff and pupils alike. By running the lessons sequentially and for a longer period of time, all pupils made significant progress across the duration of their lesson booking. This is something that we will be repeating in the future.</p> <p>Year 6: 83% of pupils could swim 25 metres confidently by the end of their block of lessons; and 76% of pupils could use a range of strikes effectively such as backstroke, front crawl and breaststroke.</p>
Funding the hiring of qualified sports coaches to teach sport in in School and for After School Clubs	£7,000	This will ensure the children have access to high quality teaching in their after school clubs to ensure high standards for provision.	Sports Coaching for Enrichment Clubs, School Lessons, Playtimes and Lunch Time Cover was provided by BADU sports coaches. They provided a range of engaging activities and PE lessons for pupils to develop, build on and engage in across all year groups.
Increasing participation in school sporting competitions including "friendlies" against other schools	£150	In partnership with other local primary schools.	Pupils trained alongside the Ranelagh Harriers Cross Country Club over 12 weeks in the Summer Terr. They then travelled to Richmond to compete in a successful cross country event hosted by the club.
High quality sports equipment to further support the PE provision	£1500	Children will have the appropriate equipment to ensure that they can participate fully in PE activities.	New nets for Volleyball, Tennis and Badminton were purchased to provide a broader range of sporting activities for directed and independent learning and play.
